

## Cech Zweigeltrebe Rose



Description: 100% Zweigelt. The Čech family winery can be found in the wine-growing village of Tvrdonice, which lies in the southernmost tip of South Moravia in the area called Moravian Slovácko well known for its busy cultural life, traditional folklore and dance. Established in 1996, the winery was initially run by passionate winemaker Jan Cech. Following Jan's death, his son Petr took over the family business. Family-run Cech uses certified low intervention and biodynamical procedures, working with rich varieties of herbs to naturally regulate pests and fertilise vines.

Tasting notes: Off dry, strawberries and cream, raspberry, summer berries.

Allergens: Contains sulfites

Dish Pairing: Strawberries and cream, aperitif, or with a summer fresh salad.

Talking Point: Moravia accounts for 91% of wine made in the Cech Republic. The most important wine producing region in the republic is Moravia, along the Austrian and Slovakian Borders. The climate is mild/continental with relatively low rainfall, on average a half to two-thirds that of Burgundy and Alsace which are on the same latitude. Warm days and cold nights mean that ripening is slowed down. Clay and sand dominate the soil
